Additional stickers for more vehicles or windshield replacement are \$5 each.

Harbor Point is a deeded community so there are rules that all owners have agreed to follow. The rules aren't that hard and make the neighborhood nicer for everyone. Areas that may need a refresher:

Property: Keep your lot maintained and clean of any boxes, trash, inoperative boats or vehicles, outside appliances, etc. Grass and weeds should be mowed and maintained.

Pool: The rules are posted at the pool and you sign a waiver each year when purchasing the keys. There is no lifeguard and these rules are to provide a safe and fun environment for everyone. No pets, food, alcohol, glass containers, running, leaving the gate open or children under 12 without an adult present.

Dogs and Cats: They belong inside, on a leash or in a fenced yard. They do not belong loose in the neighborhood.

Speed: The speed limits are posted. Follow the posted speed.

Dumpsters: The dumpsters are for normal household trash only. Not tires, mattresses, appliances, yard debris, etc. Twice a year your POA provides a larger dumpster at the marina area for those items.

Your adherence to these rules will make Harbor Point a nicer and safer place.

MORNING GLORIES

Morning glories are fast growing, annual flowing vines. The bright colored flowers have a slight fragrance and are popular with butterflies and hummingbirds. The vines grow by clinging with tendrils. The leaves are bright green heart-shaped and slender tendrils that cling to supports and just about anything else they encounter. Morning glory flowers are trumpet shaped in shades of pink, white, magenta, purple-blue and bi-colors. The buds are twirled up tightly and unfold when the morning sun hits them in the morning.

The flowers will only open when they are in direct sunlight, so an exposure with full sun will give you the longest amount of bloom time. If they are in a spot that doesn't get sun until the afternoon, don't expect morning glories. Morning glories are annuals. They will selfseed. Morning glories can start blooming by early summer, but many times they are infuriatingly slow to begin setting flowers. They have earned the nickname "back to school vine", because they have a tendency to hold off flowing until almost the fall. If your vines are growing a lot of foliage and few or no flowers it could be the soil is rich for them or they are not getting enough sun and heat. Try giving them some fertilizer that is low in nitrogen and high in phosphorous-then hope for sunny days.

I researched morning glories as I have some beautiful vines growing up my back steps and along the banister but have no blooms. I suspect not enough sun after reading this article.

Crockpot Chicken With Rice

Ingredients:

4 to 6 boneless chicken breast halves, without skin 1 can (10 3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup or cream of chicken

1/2 cup water

3/4 cup converted rice, uncooked

1 1/2 cups chicken broth

1 to 2 cups frozen green beans, thawed Preparation:

Put chicken breasts in the Crock Pot. Add cream of mushroom soup and 1/2 cup water. Add 3/4 cup of rice and the chicken broth. Add green beans. Cover and cook on LOW for 6 hours, or until chicken is cooked and rice is tender. Serves 4 to 6.

CREAMY BANANA PUDDING

1~(14~oz.) can Eagle Brand Sweetened Condensed Milk $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups cold water

- 1 (4-serving size) package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 2 cups (1 pint) heavy cream, whipped
- 36 vanilla wafers
- 3 medium bananas, sliced and dipped in lemon juice

Whisk sweetened condensed milk and water in large bowl. Add pudding mix. Whisk 2 minutes or until well blended. Chill 5 minutes. Fold in whipped cream.

Spoon 1 cup pudding mixture into 2 ¹/₂ quart glass serving bowl. Top with one third each of vanilla wafers, bananas and remaining pudding. Repeat layering twice, ending with pudding mixture.

Chill thoroughly.
