He is a diehard fisherman.


On one of **Bil's** recent fishing trips he saw an otter. The otter's use to hang around the boat slips at Galloway Marina and steal bait and fish at night.

Don't hang out too long, this is a working office, but we do enjoy the drop-ins from time to time, we just can't visit too long. :)


# Deed Restrictions are available anytime at the office. That way people know what they can and

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### Introducing the People who work for you in Harbor Point...

This is the third of a 4-part series introducing the people who work for you, the owners and residents of Harbor Point. First introduced were the ladies in the office, followed by **Pappy** (our one-man maintenance staff). Now we get to meet the ones who welcome us when we come home, the guards at the gate. Well, half of them anyway. I plan to interview the other half next issue. These men and women greet us and keep Harbor Point secure throughout the year. They screen those coming into the neighborhood, making sure if they come in with a trailer full of trash that they leave with the same trailer full of trash. The weather isn't always nice and the job isn't always easy, they are up and down, up and down, up and down their entire shift.



**Ray Marcel** --The first thing I notice when talking with Marcel is his Cajun accent, but he says he has only spent about half his life in Louisiana. His parents were shrimpers in Brownsville and he followed in their footsteps shrimping until regulations made it too difficult. He met Deloros in Brownsville and they married when he was 16. He said they have 7 children together and God only knows how many grandkids and great-grandkids, he lost track a long time ago. Marcel and his wife spent much of their life on the road together truck driving, primarily between Houston and Louisiana (owner operator). They purchased in Harbor Point in the late 90's but spent most of their time on the road and didn't move here until he retired about 10 years later. Marcel said he has been on the gate the longest, but said he quit for a while after first starting so thinks Ron Linden has the most consecutive time on the gate.



Ron Linden – Ron says he has been working at the gate on and off for about 8 years. He and his wife Benita met in Wisconsin. They raised 4 children while Ron served 20years in the Army. He was stationed in Germany for 6 years, Korea for 15 months and was in The White House for 6 years (the last year of Johnson's term and all of Nixon's) doing the communication wiring. Upon leaving the army he continued his career with computers and telephone service. If it has wires, Ron knows how it works. The club frequently calls on him to solve our electrical problems. Others call on him for handyman work as well, such as plumbing and lawn care. He devotes a lot of his time to the VFW and American Legion. He has been active with them for 35 years and has been Quarter Master here for the last 5. He is also in charge of the Honor Guard, assisting at funerals, with flag services and with the color guard. Ron said he enjoys meeting people while at the gate, be sure to say Hi when you see him and ask him how he's doing.



**Tony Lemoine**—Tony has been working the 11 to 7 shift for about 7 years. He also writes the sport's column for our newsletter. Tony is a great storyteller, always

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
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upbeat and says he has no regrets. He grew up in New Orleans and was an insurance sales manager for 22 years. He has traveled all over on business (throughout the states, Hawaii, Austria, Rome, London, cruises and his favorite, Switzerland). His children all went to school in Louisiana, four to LSU and one to Tulane on a full 5year football scholarship (they had winning seasons all 5 years, one of which was undefeated). Tony was in New Orleans during Katrina. He packed up and drove off as the eve passed over his home. He bought a motor home and traveled around the country, ending up in Texas. It was that motor home trip that brought him to the camparounds of Harbor Point. He found heaven here and decided to stay, buying a lot on Kingwood then a home on Cedar Trail. She was very active in The Harbor Point Ladies' Club, acting as the secretary/treasurer until Jane became president and Kay thought it could be perceived as a conflict of interest. At that time the secretary and treasurer became separate offices and Kay was secretary for so long she thought it might be a permanent position. During that time the club worked hard on the flag raising ceremony and getting a Harbor Point flag for a reasonable price. The club did well with bake sales and was active in caring for neighbors who were sick. Kay still assists family and neighbors when needed. She enjoys reading, puzzle books, Bible study and devoting time to her church.



Tony Santa Cruz-Tony is our newest guard, having been on the gate for just a few months. He and his wife Marcia met in 1971 while he was in the Air Force in Oklahoma and they married that same year. 

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#### **CHICKEN SOUP-GRANDMOTHER'S**

4-5 pieces of chicken	2tsp garlic power
<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> c. onion	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> lb. Velveeta cheese
<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> c. carrots	1 can Cream of chicken soup
<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> c. celery	1 box Macaroni and Cheese
3 garlic cloves or	Accent to taste

Cook chicken, garlic, onions, carrots, and celery together. Debone chicken and remove garlic, if cloves are used. Mix 1 cup liquid, without vegetables, with powdered cheese, from Macaroni and cheese. Return to pan and add Velveeta and chicken soup, melt. Add pasta. Do not add chicken until pasta is ready. Add Accent for additional flavor.

#### **CORN CHOWER**

6 slices bacon	2 c. milk
1 medium onion, coarsely chopped	¹∕₂ tsp salt
1 17 oz can cream style corn	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> c. water
2 medium potatoes, peeled and Cubed	
Dash of pepper	

Fry bacon in a Dutch oven until crisp. Remove bacon, reserving 2 tablespoon drippings. Crumble bacon and set aside. Sauté onion in reserved drippings until tender, add potatoes and water. Cover and simmer 15 to 20 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Stir in milk, corn, salt and pepper. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently until thoroughly heated. Sprinkle each serving with bacon.

#### MEXICAN CHICKEN LIME SOUP

2 tbsp. olive oil
1 onion, finely chopped
6 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
6 boneless, skinless chicken thighs cut into ½ inch pieces
2 canned chipotle chilies in adobo, chopped plus 2 tbsp. adobo sauce
6 cups chicken stock
½ cup chopped fresh cilantro
2 limes, juiced
Salt & pepper
1 Hass avocado, thinly sliced lengthwise into 12 pieces
Crushed tortilla chips

In a large saucepan, heat the olive oil over medium high heat. Stir in the onion and garlic, lower heat to medium and cook until onion begins to brown, about 7 minutes. Increase the heat to high and push the vegetables to the side of the pan. Add the chicken and cook stirring until golden about 5 minutes. Stir in the chipotles and adobo sauce, and then stir in the chicken stock. Lower heat to medium and simmer 15 minutes, skimming off any foam. Stir in cilantro and lime juice and season with salt & pepper.

Place 2 avocado slices in each of 6 soup bowls; top with the soup. Garnish with tortilla chips. Alice

#### HAMBURGER VEGETABLE SOUP

1 lb. ground beef	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> uncooked rice
1 c. carrots, diced	3 c. water
1 c. potatoes, diced	2tsp. salt
1 c. celery, diced	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> tsp basil
1 c. onions diced	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> tsp. thyme
14 oz.can tomatoes	1 bay leaf

Brown ground beef and onion in small amount of oil. When lightly browned drain off excess fat. Combine remaining ingredients in large pot. Cover and simmer for 1 hour.

#### EASY POTATO SOUP

6 med. Size potatoes	salt and pepper to taste
1 small onion chopped	1 stick oleo

Cut potatoes into small bite-size pieces and boil with onion until tender in enough water to cover. Add oleo, salt and pepper. Shut off heat and let set for 5 minutes before adding milk. Add enough milk to make the amount of soup you want. Do not use too much water for cooking potatoes.
