"Your Board of Directors..."

Your board members work very hard to make Harbor Point the best possible neighborhood. They are not paid for their time but do it because they care. I asked each of them to answer a few printed questions in hopes that we may get to know them better and understand their position. Larry Mahler, Bill Fitzgerald, Alice Lankford and Tony Santa Cruz responded and their answers are here. I did not hear back from Pat Rogers in time to include her responses.

How long have you been on the board?

Larry: From 1992 until 2015

Bill: 6 years

Alice and **Tony:** A couple of months

What sections to you cover?

Larry: I back up all board members and office.

Tony: A and B

Bill: Sections F and H **Alice**: I and G

<u>Have you served on any other neighborhood</u> associations?

Tony: No

Bill: Yes, Ridgecliffe II, Eagan Minnesota

Alice: No Larry: No

Why did you run for the board?

Larry: I was drafted by Howard Parker to help him and Mrs.

raikei.

Tony: I was approached by another director to consider running for the position. After seeing the need, I decided I wanted to serve my community in this capacity.

Bill: My primary reason came after working at the gate for several years and seeing the transition of Harbor Point from a weekend campground area with relatively few permanent residents into a primarily retirement community. I wished to keep the growth of the community going without the temptation of over-spending or frivolous expenditures.

Alice: I ran for director because I care about Harbor Point. In order for our subdivision to look good and to keep our property values up, efforts have to be made to enforce the Deed Restrictions.

What do you hope to accomplish on the board?

Alice: Over the next 3 years my goal is to assist with efforts to clean up violators of the Deed Restrictions in my sections. It is difficult for a potential property buyer to have interest in purchasing property next to a lot with inoperable vehicles, old boats with no current registration, overgrown lots and lots used for storage.

Tony: To start, I want to learn how the board functions. My goal is to keep our community a clean and safe place to live,

while being fair to all that I encounter in my capacity as a director.

Bill: My primary efforts are to ensure that the fiduciary responsibilities of the Board are maintained and the atmosphere of a relatively safe, reasonably quiet "retirement" community is maintained through reasonable, not draconian or unreasonable deed restrictions and common area rules.

Larry: Growth! Harbor Point will sell itself if we can grown and will maintain our land and keep the deed restrictions.

What accomplishments are you most proud of while on the board?

Larry: Built an office and the concrete bridge. The best is seeing HP grow with many new homes and great people.

Bill: The evenhanded enforcement of our deed restrictions, compliance with new State of Texas Laws governing Homeowner Associations and on-going budget controls. My primary accomplishment came with the change to HPPOA Deed Restrictions concerning rental properties.

What is the toughest aspect of your job?

Bill: The toughest part is dealing with property owners who have no idea that deed restrictions apply to them, where their property is located or the encroachment on other owners property.

Tony: I think it will be keeping the peace.

Larry: Arbitrator !!! Getting everybody to work together.

What is your favorite thing about Harbor Point?

Larry: "People" of all walks of life and what I can learn from them

Alice: I love living in Harbor Point. There are great people living here, almost like an extended family. I like the deer as long as they are not eating my flowers or veggies.

Bill: The residents and the atmosphere of the community.

Tony: Friendly people who genuinely care about their neighbors.

What do you like to do to relax?

Tony: Fish, cruising in my golf cart, road trips and sitting outside.

Bill: Fish

Alice: My husband and I like to fish when time allows.

Larry: Ride around and visit neighbors. Sit and watch the lake sun come up and go down.

Anything you would like to add?

Larry: I have always tried to do what is best for Harbor Point for the last 23 years not **Larry Mahler** or what I think should happen. I have found you can be only right about half the time. When dealing with two neighbors you will never be right. I am almost 75 years old and my time on earth and on the POA board is short. I wish you God's grace and speed in anything you do. It helped me.

TRINITY'S SPIKED HEAD

You've seen the 22-foot tall metal spiked head on FM356 while driving into Trinity. You've probably wondered what it is and why it's there. The artist is Jim Robertson, an artist and retired college teacher. His mother moved to Trinity in 1980, he visited on weekends and days off before moving here to open his studio, which is located right behind the sculpture. The statue, called "Wildman", was inspired by an 18th century German bear-wrestling costume. designed for and displayed at an international sculpture contest in Houston in 2000. Wildman is designed in 3 parts (head, neck and bust). There is a locked trap door in the back of the steel sculpture so that Jim can dismantle and move the piece or change the red light bulb that shines out of the eyes at night. Jim finds most of his materials locally and primarily uses metal. Some of it is donated by neighbors who come across something they think he can use. The spikes on the Wildman are from over 1400 railroad spikes, collected along local tracks here and throughout East Texas. Mr. Robertson has won several awards for other sculptures as well. Just walking around to take a picture of the Wildman, I came across several really neat pieces. I really liked his fish pieces and a cool looking birdhouse. He is inspired by a variety of metal materials, especially those from farm machines. He turned a Honda Accord into a Jet Car, a futuristic piece of art that still drives and was displayed for a few months at the Space Center in the Houston Art Car Parade. Trinity has some unique people and we are fortunate to be among such talent.
