A 6-year-old girl dies after golf cart accident in Trinity Co. By Gary Bass

TRINITY COUNTY, TX (KTRE) -

A 6-year-old Bacliff girl died January 17th after the golf cart she was riding in rolled over and landed on her in an accident that occurred about five-and-a-half miles from Trinity.

According to a press release from the Texas Department of Public Safety, the accident occurred on Huckleberry Drive at about noon Sunday. Houston County DPS troopers were dispatched out to investigate a one-vehicle crash. The preliminary accident report shows that a 2010 EZ-Go golf cart driven by an 8-year-old boy was turning around on Huckleberry Drive when the golf cart rolled onto is left side and onto the boy's passenger Kendall Lasseter. She was transported from the scene to East Texas Medical Center in Trinity, where she was pronounced dead at 1:28 p.m. Sunday. The 8-year-old boy was not injured in the accident. The accident is still under investigation.

HARBOR POINT GOLF CART RULES

- Golf Cart owner agrees to release Harbor Point Property Owners Assn. and its Board Members of any liability caused by a golf cart or to a golf cart from any HPPOA facility.
- 2. There will be no alcoholic beverages on golf carts.
- 3. All golf carts must be electric powered only.
- 4. All golf carts must be of four- wheeled style.
- 5. Only golf carts equipped with both front and rear lights may be operated after dark.
- All cart owners are required to follow all rules pertaining to any other type motor vehicle and have a valid driver's license. Children under 18 must be accompanied by licensed driver in front seat in order to operate carts on our streets.
- 7. A flag on a 6-foot pole to be mounted on the rear of each golf cart.
- 8. All carts require a unique sticker (no longer the same as for our motor vehicles). The fee of \$5.00 will be charged twice a year for each golf cart, and due at the same time as property dues. Valid sticker is a small purple rectangle. You must also use the numbered stickers given by the office when you register your golf cart on the vehicle either on the bottom of the windshield or a conspicuous place on the body of the cart. You keep that number as long as you have that golf cart and it is in running condition.
- 9. Please notify the office if you sell, destroy, remove the golf cart from Harbor Point so that we do not continue to bill you for that golf cart.
- 10. All of the above rules will be enforced, and a signed copy will be put in a permanent file.

DIPS

COWBOY DIP

½ pound ground beef

½ pound pork sausage

½ cup chopped onion

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1 can Rotel

2 pounds Velveeta Cheese

Brown ground beef, sausage and onion. Drain fat. In large sauce pan chuck cheese and melt slowly, stirring to prevent scorching, add soup, Rotel to meat mixture.

Serve warm.

BLACK BEAN SALSA

1 can (15 oz) black beans, drained & rinsed

1 can Rotel

1/2 cup whole corn, frozen or canned

1/4 cup chopped onion

1/4 cup chopped cilantro

1 tablespoon lime juice

1/4 teaspoon ground cumin

Mix all ingredients in a medium bowl. Cover and refrigerate

for 30 minutes to allow flavors to blend.

Serve with chips or as tacos.

Broccoli Dip

2 packages frozen chopped broccoli

2 packages Kraft garlic cheese

1 onion, chopped

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1 can mushrooms

1/4 stick butter

Saute onions in butter. Cook broccoli in boiling salted water, drain. Add everything and cook until cheese melts. Serve hot in crock pot.

Awesome Dip

1 pound bacon, fried and crumbled 24 oz cream cheese, softened 8 oz Parmesan cheese, grated 1 bunch green onions, finely chopped Mix and bake at 325 for 25 minutes.

OMG!!! BLT Dip

Ingredients:

1-1/2 pound bacon, cooked, drained, crumbled, and divided

2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

2 (8-ounce) packages cream cheese, softened

1/2 cup sour cream

1/4 cup mayonnaise

1 cup cheddar cheese (shredded) or to taste

1/2 teaspoon Italian seasoning

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder (or to taste)

1 tablespoons mustard

2 cups chopped seeded tomatoes

1-1/2 cup shredded Iceberg lettuce

pepper an salt to taste

Toasted bread rounds, crackers, or pita chips.

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Spray a 11/2-quart baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.

Set aside 3/4 cup crumbled bacon.

In a large bowl, combine remaining bacon, cream cheese, shredded cheeses, sour cream, mayonnaise, Italian seasoning, garlic powder, salt, pepper, and mustard. Spoon mixture into prepared baking dish. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Sprinkle chopped tomatoes, remaining 3/4 cup crumbled bacon, and Iceberg lettuce over hot dip. Serve immediately with toasted bread rounds, crackers, or pita chips.

Fiesta Appetizer Dip

1 can (15 ounces) refried beans

1 envelope taco seasoning

3 ripe avocados, halved, seeded and peeled

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/4 cup sour cream

1 can (2-1/4 ounces) sliced ripe olives, drained

1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chilies, drained

2 medium tomatoes, chopped


6 green onions, sliced

1 cup (4 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese

Tortilla chips

Directions

Combine beans and taco seasoning. Spread mixture on a round 12-in. serving platter. Mash avocados with lemon juice. Spread over beans. Spread sour cream over avocado. Sprinkle olives, chilies, tomatoes, onions and cheese over sour cream. Serve with tortilla chips. Yield: 8-10 servings.
