Harbor Point is a deeded community, which you should be aware of when you purchase property here. Those rules are enforced by the **Harbor Point Property Owners Association (HPPOA)**. If you are a property owner, you are part of **HPPOA**. As a group we elect board members to run the **HPPOA**. As property owners we pay the association dues and they provide the needed services for the community. They see that the rules are followed and use our dues for our guards at the gate, the staff in the office, any needed extra security, general maintenance, mowing of common areas, road repairs, lights on the streets, electricity and water for the pool, marina and clubhouse, trash removal, all the things necessary for this to be a livable place.

Get involved in your POA.

In addition to the usual **HPPOA** meeting information, the board accepted board nominations for two positions.

NOMINEES ARE:

Bill FitzGerald CJ Vice Keith Rippy Johnny Boyd

If you or someone you know would like to run for the Board. Nominatations will be taken at March 19th HPPOA meeting.

<u>HPPOA Board of Directors</u> Eligibility:

Must be a property owner in **Harbor Point** No deed violations, outstanding fines or fees Under Texas Law - No felony conviction.

General Duties:

Manage the business affairs of the **Harbor Point Property Association** mandated by the governing bylaws, deed restrictions and Texas State Law including but not limited to:

a. Set rules governing the use of common areas, recreational facilities, architectural control matters, and guidelines of conduct for members and their guests and enforce such matters as necessary.

b. Solicit bids and approve contracts for maintenance of common areas, roads and facilities.

c. Hire/fire and supervise personnel employed by the Association.

d. To exercise for the Association, all powers, duties and authority not specifically reserved for the membership or limited by the by-law and/or deed restrictions.

Board Composition:

The current **Board of Directors** is comprised of five members elected for a staggered three year term so that no more than two director positions are open at any one time. Board members are elected for Director positions only and not for a specific title or position within the Board.

a, The **HPPOA** President is determined by the vote of the Board in May of each year following the Annual Meeting of the Association.

b. Supervision of the security gate and it's personnel is the responsibility of one of the Directors,

c. General day to day operations and supervision of office and maintenance personnel is normally handled by the President of the Association.

d. Architectural review and approvals are handled by individual directors by section ie: Sections A & B, C & D, F & H and G & I. The full Board may also rule on such items upon request of a property owner or the Director involved.

General comments and personal observations:

a. The fiduciary responsibility is the highest priority of a Board member, The Board does not nor intend to be frivolous in its allocation of Association finances.

b. Due diligence in the application of the rules and guidelines as they apply to all matters are handled fairly and uniformly, We are, after all human and occasionally when errors occur every effort is made to correct such error in a fair and reasonable manner.

c. Know the **Harbor Point** complex, especially the sections for which you are responsible. Drive around on a regular basis and look just not see, Be aware of what is going on,

d, <u>Listen!</u> To your neighbors, other Board members and employees. There are good ideas floating around out there, The "No" position is not always the way to approach things.

e, Other than the President and Gate supervisor positions, a Board position is not overly time consuming. It does occasionally interfere with your personal life but not to the point of being intrusive.

The Texas Department of State Health

Services issued a fish consumption advisory for Lake Livingston and portions of the Trinity River after lab testing of fish samples found an elevated amount of harmful chemical compounds. The compounds, dioxins and polychlorinated biphenyls or PCBs, are chemically-related compounds that are persistent environmental pollutants, according to the World Health Organization. The advisory is in effect for the Trinity River Basin which includes Lake Livingston and the Trinity River from U.S. 287, near Anderson County, downstream to U.S. 90, near Liberty. The TXDSHS says regular or long-term consumption of fish of these waters may increase the likelihood of long-term health risks. The TXDSHS says regular or long-term consumption of fish from these waters may increase the likelihood of long-term health risks. People can still fish in the area though the DSHS says they should not consume or should limit their consumption of fish from this area and are advised to follow the specific age and species recommendations chart. . One set of guidelines applies to women of childbearing age and children age 17 and younger, who are particularly sensitive to methylmercury (the most prevalent and toxic form of mercury in fish). A second set applies to women beyond their childbearing years and men. Mercury contamination of fish is a global problem. Both gold and mercury were mined in the Trinity River watershed and some mercury remains today. The inactive Altoona Mercury Mine is located along the East Fork Trinity River and is reported to contribute significantly to the mercury content of Trinity Lake. Gold miners used mercury to extract gold from mined materials and discharged the waste into streams, where the mercury accumulated in the sediment. Liquid mercury moves relatively slowly through river systems and accumulates in places where sediments are trapped, such as reservoirs. Bacteria convert this inorganic form of mercury into a more toxic, organic form, known as methylmercury, which fish take in from their diet. Methylmercury can accumulate in fish to concentrations many thousands of times greater than mercury levels in the surrounding water. Because methylmercury accumulates in fish slowly over time, larger fish of a species usually have higher concentrations of methylmercury than smaller fish from the same water body. Predatory fish, such as bass, generally contain more methylmercury than non-predatory fish, such as trout. Developing fetuses and children are especially sensitive to methylmercury. Pregnant women and nursing mothers can pass on methylmercury to their fetuses or infants through the placenta and through breast milk. Excessive exposure to methylmercury can affect the nervous system in children, leading to subtle decreases in learning ability, language skills, attention, and memory. These effects may occur through adolescence as the nervous system continues to develop. For this reason, a more conservative set of guidelines applies to women of childbearing years and children up to and including age 17. The levels of methylmercury found in fish from these lakes and rivers should not result in the health effects described above if the proposed guidelines are followed. The

extent of health effects depends on the amount of methylmercury that people ingest from the fish that they eat and is also related to a person's body weight. Fish are a nutritious part of your diet when eaten in moderate amounts. By following OEHHA's safe eating guidelines for eating fish from this region, you can still enjoy eating fish from these water bodies while minimizing your risk of health effects from exposure to methylmercury.
